If you are not comfortable with command-line tools, you can open Active Directory Sites and Services under Administrative Tools, right click the NTDS Settings object, and select All Tasks Check Replication Topology. If you still receive errors because the KCC did not create the appropriate connection objects, manually create a connection object between the domain controllers.

Auditing Active Directory is necessary from both a security point of view and for meeting compliance requirements. Organizations majorly favor native Active Directory audit methods provided by Event Viewer (a large pool where events are stored in an unorganized manner).

How to Enable the Security Auditing of Active Directory

To audit user access to Active Directory objects, configure the Audit Directory Service Access event category in the audit policy setting. NOTES. You must grant the Manage Auditing And Security Log user right to the computer where you want to either configure an audit policy setting or review an audit log.

To audit Active Directory Federation Service (AD FS): Configure audit policies for the domain controllers and Windows servers on which AD FS activity needs to be audited. Configuring security log size and retention settings Security log size and retention settings must be configured to prevent loss of audit data due to overwriting of events.

Directory service change auditing, where appropriate, indicates the old and new values of the changed properties of the objects that were changed. Only objects with SACLs cause audit events to be generated, and only when they are accessed in a manner that matches their SACL entries.
