Little is known about the long-term effects of general anesthesia on the fetus. In this issue of *Anesthesiology*, Palanisamy and colleagues show that exposure of fetal rats in utero to 4 h of isoflurane at gestational age 14 days (roughly equivalent to second trimester in humans) leads to impaired spatial memory acquisition and perhaps greater impulsivity in young adulthood. 1

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Complications associated with surgery under general anesthesia during pregnancy include risk of DVT, pulmonary embolism (PE), aspiration (decreased cardiac sphincter tone, decreased gastric emptying, increased gastric pressures, and hyperemesis increase the risk of regurgitation and aspiration), pulmonary edema, acute respiratory distress syndrome (ARDS), spontaneous abortion during the first trimester, and preterm labor.

Fetal risk of anesthesia and surgery during pregnancy
Research strongly indicates that the rate of maternal death due to general anesthesia may be at least double the death rate from regional anesthesia. The primary cause of maternal death from general anesthesia is a difficulty with airway management. The greatest concern for the baby is the decrease in uterine blood flow and neonatal depression.

Anesthesia for Fetal Surgery Fetal surgery (surgery performed on a pregnant mother to treat her baby before it is born) can occur either during the middle of pregnancy or at the end of the pregnancy. In all cases, anesthesiologists are involved to provide for the comfort and safety of pregnant mothers and their babies.

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Anesthesia for Fetal Surgery

There have been at least five studies that have looked at the risk for birth defects in women who had surgery and anesthesia in the first and early second trimester of pregnancy. The studies did not show an increased risk for birth defects. Could exposure to general anesthesia in the second or third trimester cause other pregnancy complications?

Fetal interventions present a unique therapeutic opportunity. With advances in medical imaging technology, fetuses can be screened for anatomic congenital defects early in the course
