Physical Examination of the Shoulder | Musculoskeletal Key

Assess the temperature over the front of the shoulder (the glenohumeral joint). Palpate the bony landmarks for tenderness, starting at the sternoclavicular joint, then the clavicle, acromioclavicular joint, acromion process and around the scapula. Palpate the glenohumeral joint line – anterior and posterior.

Examination of the shoulder | Versus Arthritis

The shoulder joint of each arm should be assessed and compared. If the patient is known to have an issue with a particular shoulder, you should assess the 'normal' shoulder first for comparison. Active movement. Active movement refers to a movement performed independently by the patient. Ask the patient to carry out a sequence of active movements to assess joint function.

Swelling of the shoulder joint may be visible due to a joint effusion, or synovial thickening. Deformity of the joint and fractures and dislocations are usually obvious (figure 37a,b). Table 4 provides details of the muscles of the shoulder and figure 38a–d illustrations of the anterior and posterior bones and muscles of the upper limb.

Ask the patient to place the hand of the side you are examining on the contralateral shoulder and then push the elbow superiorly to compress the acromium against the lateral end of the clavicle Hawkins-Kennedy test (positive in shoulder impingement) Flex the shoulder to 90 o with the elbow flexed to 90 o.

The Painful Shoulder: Part I. Clinical Evaluation ...

Motor testing of the shoulder should follow the examination of the range of motion. Each motion should be tested for strength. The major muscles used to move the shoulder are the deltoid, pectoralis major, latissimus dorsi, biceps, and triceps. In addition, there are smaller stabilizing muscles, including the rotator cuff muscles.

Skillful examination of the shoulder is an integral part of this evaluation and is necessary to generate an appropriate differential diagnosis and to help determine whether advanced imaging is needed. The large number of shoulder examination techniques, often named for their originators, can be confusing.

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
